On June 11, 1968, California Congressman George E. Brown proposed the House Joint Resolution 1299. Brown's proposal was passed quickly and President Lyndon B. Johnson signed it on Sept. 17, 1968. This law was one of the first steps toward the current month-long celebration of the Hispanic people.

Three other similar joint resolutions had also been proposed, which have been made to recognize and conserve traditions through positive approaches. Though they were not as recognized as the week-long house joint resolution Brown passed, the bills helped build the momentum that would become National Hispanic Heritage Month.
