
"They should be responsible and a good role model. In addition, they need to know the strengths and weaknesses of their peers and utilize both of them."

- Tiffany Wong, junior




"They know how to take initiative and be able to take charge of any problem."

- Ben Olsen, senior




"They must respect others, and must be assertive and confident in making decisions."
